At the end of the 19th century, many factory workers lived in small houses in the middle of smog-riddled cities and faced very bleak futures. Some businessmen realised that they could improve how much work their workers did if they made sure they were nurtured. George Cadbury was one of these men.

George had built up the Cadbury chocolate company with his brother Richard; it soon outgrew its premises in the middle of Birmingham. In 1879, they moved to the historic village of Bournville. It was so picturesque that it was nicknamed the 'Factory in a Garden'.

When Richard died in 1899, George was deeply affected. He wanted to look after his workers, so he decided to build a village for them in Bournville. He made a gift of 313 homes that they could buy and live in.

Some people began to buy these houses and sell them for profit, so George built more that could only be rented by people on a low income. Today, these houses are still rented out to families on lower incomes.

The new village was one of the first to contain parks and open spaces to make the factory workers' lives better.

Chocolate Different Chocolate



Not all chocolate is created equal. You might think that milk chocolate is the same all around the world, but you'd be wrong.

One of the most important ingredients in chocolate is cocoa. Some types of chocolate contain more cocoa and less milk - the more cocoa it contains, the more bitter it will be. When you shop in a supermarket, you might notice some chocolate is labelled 65% or 80% cocoa, for instance. That means that there is a lot more cocoa than in your average milk chocolate bar (Cadbury's Dairy Milk has 26% and Galaxy has 25%). In the USA, the requirements are much lower - Hershey's chocolate only contains 11% cocoa!

It's not only cocoa that affects the taste. In Europe, most milk chocolate is made using fresh milk, which gives it a certain taste and texture. However, because the USA is so big, fresh milk curdled before it could be used when chocolate was first made. Instead, they used dehydrated milk, which gave a very different taste.

Not only that, because American chocolate generally has less cocoa, it contains much more sugar. All this doesn't necessarily make it any worse; it's just an acquired taste for travelers!



Chocolate has always been seen as something of a luxury - even everyday brands such as Cadbury and Galaxy advertise the luxurious and elegant qualities of their bars. However, some companies take it to a new level and target only those with deep bank balances.

It must be said that there is only so much you can do to chocolate to make it more exclusive, therefore many of the most expensive chocolates are actually made so because of the things that come with them.

For instance, the most expensive chocolate ever was something called Le Chocolat Box by Simon Jewelers. Each small box of chocolates (either 9 or 12 in a box) also contained jewellery from the designer's own collection. These gave them an eye-watering price tag of \$1.5 million per box!

Even the second most expensive - a 2008 box from Harrods made by the chocolate company Patchi - cost \$10,000 a box! However, each of the 49 chocolates was wrapped in delicate silk, placed on a cushion of leather and separated by pieces of gold, platinum and crystals.

JS Fry



While they may not be the first name you think of when you hear the word "chocolate", the Fry brand has been around longer than any other in England.

The story of one of the most famous chocolate families in Britain began with Joseph Fry in 1753. He had just trained as a doctor and opened a small business in Bristol. It was in the port (one of the busiest in the world at the time) that he saw the sailors returning from the New World with obscure brown beans - cacao.

Fry was convinced that these cacao or cocoa beans had amazing health properties, and he began to sell them. Soon, he upgraded his factories, and by 1777 he was producing the best hot chocolate powder in Britain.

It wasn't until Fry's grandsons took over the business in 1835 that they discovered what we would know as chocolate today. By mixing cocoa with sugar and cocoa fat, they could mould it into a bar.

In 1919, Frys became part of the Cadbury brand, and the name Fry was removed from all products in 1981. However, many people will still recognise the name Fry as being synonymous with chocolate.



Mesoamerica



Chocolate has been a favoured dish for centuries. Tribes in Mesoamerica (an area that covers Mexico, Costa Rica, Honduras and more today) considered it one of their most important foods.

The Aztec, Maya and Olmec civilisations were brewing hot chocolate drinks as far back as 1900 BCE. The Olmec were the earliest known civilisation to do this; they used to drink it from special cups called tecomates. The Maya and Aztec also had special vessels to drink this most important beverage from, but theirs were much taller and richly decorated.

These early drinks were made from different varieties of the cacao bean (the Aztecs called them cacahuatl). The drink itself was called xocolatl (it's pronounced shoc-o-lat-ul), which is most likely where the word chocolate comes from. Cacao beans were so highly valued that the Aztecs used them as currency!

Early chocolate drinks would have been much more watery and bitter than modern chocolate but were often flavoured with things like honey or vanilla. It wasn't until much later on that milk chocolate was invented.


