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Continuous Provision Enhancements

Reading Area: Writing Area: Display the days of the week for the children to read Images from the story for children to write sentences and refer to during independent learning. Other books by Eric Carle. Blank folded books for the children to write their own Non-fiction books about life cycles, in particular the life version of the story. cycle of the butterfly. Facts about caterpillars and butterflies.
