Jack and Jill - Initial Sounds



Guidance Materials:

Based on the songs shown in the Little Baby Bum videos by Moonbug.

Please see the <u>Phonics Shed</u> pronunciation videos on Youtube before teaching this lesson (specifically for 'j/j/, <u>Chapter 2 Set 6</u>). Pure sounds must be used (/j/ rather than 'juh' or 'jay') when talking about intitial sounds as it can hamper children's development in blending and segmenting words.

Resources

- Jack and Jill Song Sheet (Resource 1)
- Phonics Shed Sound Board Game
- Resource 2 (adult examples)
- Resources 3 to 5 (per child, as needed)
- OPTIONAL:
- Phonics Shed Chapter 2 Flashcards to match sounds to letter names
- Jack and Jill song video by Moonbug
- The <u>instrumental version</u> from the official album by Piccolo

Introduction/Objective

- The objective of today's lesson is to orally identify the initial sounds of words (this can be extended to writing initial sounds if the children are able).
- Read the nursery rhyme Jack and Jill (**Resource 1**).
- Alternatively, you may choose to watch the <u>Moonbug video (or listen to it</u>).

Whole Group

Analysis of the rhyme through questioning, for example:

- Can you hear which sound is in both Jack and Jill?
- Is it the first, middle or last sound that is the same?
- Does anyone here have a name that starts with the same sound as Jack and Jill?
- Does anyone here have a name that starts with the same sound as someone else?

Independent Activities

Suggested set up: one or two groups working with adult support and another working independently.

ICT

- Use the Phonics Shed soundboard for this task.
- Ask the children to choose the farm animal that starts with a /d/ sound. Try with different sounds. You can use the other soundboards (e.g., beach, jungle) for this task too.
- Simplify Read the animal names to the children: 'sheep', 'horse', 'duck', 'cow', dog', 'cat'.
- **Expect** Ask the children to say all the animal names first.
- Extend Ask the children to match the two animals that have the same sound at the start (cat and cow).

Sorting

- Group some names that begin with the same initial sound to make a new nursery rhyme. Try to use names of children there, however there are some name suggestions on **Resource 2** if this is not possible.
- **Simplify** Orally match names of children in the group by sound.
- **Expect** Orally match names by the initial sound of children in the group or children they know.
- **Extend** Orally match names by the initial sound of children in the group or children they know. Invite children to think of a place or thing to rhyme with one of the names, e.g., Percy and Polly went in a trolley, Sally and Sam were in a pram.
- You may wish to extend to making a new Jack and Jill rhyme using the <u>instrumental version</u> of the song.

Physical

- Hunt for objects around the classroom that begin with the same sound.
- **Simplify** Children find objects to match pictures of typical classroom items beginning with the same initial sound (**Resource 3**).
- Expect Children find objects beginning with a given initial sound. (Resource 4).
- **Extend** Children find objects and identify the initial sound, then group them (**Resource 5**).

Plenary

- 😥 Give positive feedback and praise for what the children have done well during the session. Address any misconceptions.
- 👧 "Today we looked at names that start with the same sound. Can you share some examples of ones you thought of?
- ullet Shall we turn these into a verse together?"E.g., Percy and Polly went in a trolley to buy a packet of sweets.
- 😥 Extend Tell the children that words that start with the same sound have a special name: alliteration.

Further Teaching Points

- Listen to the Jack the Jungle Explorer song on the Phonics Shed Youtube Channel.
 Can you do the action for Jack when you hear a /j/ sound? The action is pulling on an imaginary hat.
 You can also make up your own actions to the song or act it.
- Read Jack the Jungle Explorer (Phonics Shed Teaching Book, Chapter 2 Set 6). Ask the children to clap (or otherwise indicate) when they hear the /j/ sound like at the start of 'Jack' and 'Jill'.
