## Reasons for selection and synopsis

Boggis, Bunce and Bean are the meanest three farmers you could meet. They are determined to get Mr Fox - but he has other plans!

Fantastic Mr Fox is a true classic that will have your children gripped and roaring with laughter.

#### Before reading...

Ask the children to look at the front cover. What do you think the book will be about? What things can you see on the front cover?

What sort of story will it be? Who might enjoy it?

Think of the title Fantastic Mr Fox. What might it tell you about the story?

Now read the blurb. What does this tell you about the story?

Make some predictions about what might happen in the story.

Look at the author Roald Dahl. Do you know any of his other stories? Which ones can you name?
