Story time- Share other stories written by John Burningham- e.g. 'Would You Rather?', 'The Magic Bed', 'Mr Gumpy's Outing', 'The Shopping Basket', 'More Would You Rather', 'Simp', 'Husherbye', 'Borka: The Adventures of a Goose with No Feathers'.

Other small group activities- ELG 01/ELG 05- Children to follow instructions for a simple recipe containing avocado- e.g. avocado on toast, guacamole, avocado smoothie Homework – Ask children to bring in a baby photo from home. Encourage children to discuss with their parents/carers what they were like as babies- what did they like, what could they do etc.
